## **P**astoral Thoughts

### **Welcome to Ordinary time**

We have now entered the long stretch of ordinary time in the church, which will extend through the fall, until we reach advent. Ordinary time is any time on the churches calendar that does not include the following seasons: Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter and runs either 33 or 34 weeks long, depending on the year.

Although the time is called Ordinary Time, it is anything but ordinary. It is a time when the church teaches us with a wide variety of scriptures that touch on many of the social and relational issues we deal with today. Every week there are life lessons to learn and grow from.

It is called ordinary time because the weeks are numbered in sequence and derived from the Latin "ordinalis" which refers to numbers in a series. This parallels the ordered life of the Church. It is the time we spend in a vigilant watch for the second coming rather than in feasting or penance.

And in our Gospel today we see this expressed in Christ's teaching of the disciples. He is explaining to them concepts in a way they can grasp an elementary understanding of this great mystery. He uses elements found in nature that they are familiar with, to tell them about the kingdom of heaven. Although they are not fully prepared to understand all He has to teach them, they are now able to begin to put the pieces together.

So, my friends, let us not take ordinary time for granted but rather as a time to gain a better understanding of our faith and move closer to the Heaven that is mentioned today.
