This weekend we celebrate the solemn commemoration of the institution of the sacrament of the Body and Blood. For today the Church expresses its gratitude to Christ, who by instituting the Holy Eucharist gave the Church its greatest treasure and nourishment.



During Holy Week, on Holy Thursday – we recreate, and live, this special moment that precedes His Passion, a time and moment where Joy was suppressed due to the gravity of the moment. But today we can thank our Lord for this gift of Love that nourishes us each day.

In the past, it was common for the parish priest to have a procession to begin this celebration, but today it is usually a diocesan event where the bishop invites the people to a procession near the cathedral or a designated parish. This year Bishop Johnston will lead a procession for our diocese on Sunday, June 6, at 1:30 at Sacred Heart/Guadalupe Parish in Kansas City, MO.

So, today as we come together in fellowship to celebrate the Holy Mass, I encourage you to listen to the Eucharistic prayer with to be a little more focused than usual and take a few moments to contemplate what a blessing we have been given, and take your seat at the Feast.

The Office of Diocesan Archives proudly announces the release of *Catholic Kansas City* written by diocesan archivist, Dr. Zachary Daughtrey, with Bishop James V. Johnston, Jr. penning the book's forward.

Published through Arcadia Publishing as part of their popular Images of America series, *Catholic Kansas City* is a pictorial history tracing the earliest foundations of Catholicism in Kansas City during the 1830s up through the second renovation of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in 2003.

Chapters exploring parishes, diocesan bishops, Catholic education, and more are included in the manuscript. Our Lady of Sorrows is featured in the book.

Catholic Kansas City was released on April 5, 2021 and is sold for \$21.99. Amazon and Barnes and Nobles are sold out.
