

astoral Thoughts
Greetings Brothers and Sister,

Today our scriptures are rich in content referring to what would become to us "The Eucharist." In the first reading our Lord hears the cries of the people and provides them with quail in the evenings and bread (manna) in the morning to sustain them.

In our gospel we hear the people asking Jesus for a sign so that they could believe, just as the Israelites had received in the desert. How quickly they forget all the signs that have already been shown them: The multiplication of the fish and loaves, the healing of the sick, and the driving out of demons.

So, Christ tells them that they will be offered the bread of life that is Him, and whoever comes to Him will never hunger or thirst. We will hear in the coming weeks that the Jews were taken aback at what Jesus says to them, and begin to let doubt slip into their minds, because it was a concept, they struggled to understand instead of just having faith.

So often in our lives today, people find it easier to listen to a lie that is being promoted rather than the truth. The power of a lie is powerful and comforting to many. It enables them to believe anything they wish to, rather than acknowledging the truth. For if they acknowledge what the truth is – then they know they must act on it or follow it – accountability is scary for them.

Christ's whole ministry was abut presenting the truth to people. For knowing the truth is more than just rules and laws
