Our Gospel delivers a strong message today, for Jesus is saying He is the fulfillment of the promise. For He is the only begotten Son of God and speak with all authority.

This is the later part of the Bread of Life discourse that we have been hearing about for the last few weeks and Christ is now a little more revealing with the people as He says, "And the bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world."
