


From our Pastoral Associate:

Today marks the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, which is always celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time. On this day, we are called to reflect on what it means for Christ to be the King, not just of our hearts, not just of our lives, but over the entirety of creation. All things are under the loving will of this most august King of Kings and Lord of Lords, who has conquered death in order to bring us to glory. Jesus reigns throughout the universe by his nature as God. He speaks but a word and the universe is made, the planets spin in orbit, land is raised from the sea. At his command all of creation comes into existence from nothing. He is all powerful, all knowing, and all wise. He is everywhere present. He writes history as if it's a book. But even so, he asks us to reign in our hearts. Consider that God, who can do all things and create out of nothing, waits for our permission to enter our hearts and to bring us joy and salvation. 

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Andrew the Apostle

St. Andrew was the brother of Simon Peter. In the Orthodox tradition, Andrew is described as the "First-called." According to the Gospel of John, Andrew was standing with the apostle John when St. John the Baptist cried out "Behold the Lamb of God!" (Jn 1:36). Andrew and John immediately started to follow Jesus and it was Andrew that first brought Simon Peter to Jesus (v. 41-42). At a later time, Andrew and Peter were fishing when Jesus climbed into their boat to preach. Jesus told them to put down their nets for a catch. The result was so overwhelming (two boats so full of fish that they were in danger of sinking) that they dropped everything to be Jesus' disciples. It was Andrew that brought the boy with loaves and fish to Jesus. Andrew later preached in many places including Thrace and Byzantium, as well as around the Black Sea and as far as Kiev. He is considered to be the patron saint of Ukraine, Romania, and Russia. The Eastern Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople is considered to be the successor of St. Andrew. St. Andrew was martyred by crucifixion in Achaea in 60 AD. When given the pronouncement of his death sentence, St. Andrew asked to be crucified on an X-shaped cross because he did not feel himself worthy to die on the same kind of cross as Jesus.

Catholic Movie Night

Our first Catholic Movie Night, hosted by the Legion of Mary, will be on Sunday, Dec 10th at 6pm. Our first movie will be The Scarlet and the Black: When the Nazis took control of Italy during WWII, they occupied Rome. A priest in the Vatican, Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty (Gregory Peck) is in charge of the escape network of those that are wanted by the Nazis. Msgr. O'Flaherty is soon identified by the SS as the leader of the escape organization and the real cat and mouse game between the Irish priest and Colonel Herbert Kappler (Christopher Plummer), head of the Gestapo, begins. Based on a true story.

For Your Reflection:

The kingdom of God, in the words of our Lord and Savior, does not come for all to see; nor shall they say: Behold, here it is, or behold, there it is, but the kingdom of God is within us, for the word of God is very near, in our mouth and in our heart. Thus it is clear that he who prays for the coming of God's kingdom prays rightly to have it within himself, that there it may grow and bear fruit and become perfect. For God reigns in each of his holy ones. Anyone who is holy obeys the spiritual laws of God, who dwells in him as in a well-ordered city. The Father is present in the perfect soul, and with him Christ reigns, according to the words: We shall come to him and make our home with him. Thus the kingdom of God within us, as we continue to make progress, will reach its highest point when the Apostle's words are fulfilled, and Christ, having subjected all his enemies to himself, will hand over his kingdom to God the Father, that God may be all in all. Therefore, let us pray unceasingly with that disposition of soul which the Word may make divine, saying to our Father who is in heaven: Hallowed by thy name; thy kingdom come. Note this too about the kingdom of God. It is not a sharing of justice with iniquity, nor a society of light with darkness, nor a meeting of Christ with Belial. The kingdom of God cannot exist alongside the reign of sin. Therefore, if we wish God to reign in us, in no way should sin reign in our mortal body; rather we should mortify our members which are upon the earth and bear fruit in the Spirit. There should be in us a kind of spiritual paradise where God may walk and be our sole ruler with his Christ. In us the Lord will sit at the right hand of that spiritual power which we wish to receive. And he will sit there until all his enemies who are within us become his footstool, and every principality, power and virtue in us is cast out. All this can happen in each one of us, and the last enemy, death, can be destroyed; then Christ will say in us: O death, where is your sting? O hell, where is your victory? And so, what is corruptible in us must be clothed in holiness and incorruptibility; and what is mortal must be clothed, now that death has been conquered, in the Father's immortality. Then God will reign in us, and we shall enjoy even now the blessings of rebirth and resurrection.
