From our Pastoral Associate:

Today is what is known as Gaudete Sunday, which falls on the third Sunday of Advent, when the rose candle on the Advent wreath is lit and the priest customarily wears rose vestments (though this is optional). Gaudete means "Rejoice!" and comes from the Entrance Antiphon that quotes Phil 4:4-5: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near." This



invitation to rejoice is echoed in our first reading in which we are told shout for joy and sing joyful because "the King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst, you have no further misfortune to fear." It is also in our second reading from Philippians where we are told to rejoice because "The Lord is near."

We are encouraged to rejoice during this time of Advent because the readings focus on three comings of Christ: his first coming– represented by the prophecy of Jeremiah, his present coming in the Eucharist – represented by the reading from Philippians, and his Second coming– represented by John the Baptist's preaching to be ready for the coming of the Messiah. Joy is not the same as happiness, which is our final end– but a response of love– which reaches its fullest extent when focused upon God.

This is a time, not to fret about how well we have prepared for Christmas during this Advent, but to reflect upon what God has given us and to be thankful. So I encourage you to take some time and think upon your blessings.

And so I encourage you to thank God for each and every one. Ask yourself this: Do I have family? Do I have friends? Do I live in the comfort of a warm home? Consider these and many more blessings as you reflect on what God has given you. Be sure to take time to give him proper thanks. And most importantly, don't forget to rejoice in all the good that he has given for you and all that he will yet do. Take time also to thank him for coming to us in our misery to share in our lot and to redeem us by the cross.

Take time also to do an inventory of your spiritual life. Have I done much prayer during this Advent? What can I do to improve? When was the last time I went to confession? Taking time to thank God, grow in prayer, and to prepare for Christ's coming is exactly what Advent is about.

Ministries & Reflections



Saints of the Week- St. Peter Canisius

Peter Canisius was born in 1521 in the Netherlands. At the age of 19 he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards he met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced Peter so much that he joined the recently formed Society of Jesus. At this early age Peter had already taken up a practice he continued throughout his life-a process of study, reflection, prayer, and writing. After his ordination in 1546, he became widely known for his editions of the writings of St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great. Besides this reflective literary bent, Peter had a zeal for the apostolate. He could often be found visiting the sick or imprisoned. In 1547, Peter attended several sessions of the Council of Trent, whose decrees he was later assigned to implement. After a brief teaching assignment at the Jesuit college at Messina, Peter was entrusted with the mission to Germany. He taught in several universities and was instrumental in establishing many colleges and seminaries. He wrote a catechism that explained the Catholic faith in a way that common people could understand—a great need of that age. Renowned as a popular preacher, Peter packed churches with those eager to hear his eloquent proclamation of the gospel. At 70, Peter suffered a paralytic seizure, but he continued to preach and write with the aid of a secretary, until his death in his hometown of Nijmegen, Netherlands, on December 21, 1597.

For Your Reflection:

Though holy doctors have uncovered many mysteries and wonders, and devout souls have understood them in this earthly condition of ours, yet the greater part still remains to be unfolded by them, and even to be understood by them.

We must then dig deeply in Christ. He is like a rich mine with many pockets containing treasures: however deep we dig we will never find their end or their limit. Indeed, in every pocket new seams of fresh riches are discovered on all sides.

For this reason the apostle Paul said of Christ: In him are hidden all the treasures of the wisdom and knowledge of God. The soul cannot enter into these treasures, nor attain them, unless it first crosses into and enters the thicket of suffering, enduring interior and exterior labors, and unless it first receives from God very many blessings in the intellect and in the senses, and has undergone long spiritual training.

All these are lesser things, disposing the soul for the lofty sanctuary of the knowledge of the mysteries of Christ: this is the highest wisdom attainable in this life.

Would that men might come at last to see that it is quite impossible to reach the thicket of the riches and wisdom of God except by first entering the thicket of much suffering, in such a way that the soul finds there its consolation and desire. The soul that longs for divine wisdom chooses first, and in truth, to enter the thicket of the cross.

Saint Paul therefore urges the Ephesians not to grow weary in the midst of tribulations, but to be rooted and grounded in love, so that they may know with all the saints the breadth, the length, the height and the depth—to know what is beyond knowledge, the love of Christ, so as to be filled with all the fullness of God. The gate that gives entry into these riches of his wisdom is the cross; because it is a narrow gate, while many seek the joys that can be gained through it, it is given to few to desire to pass through it.


