

From our Pastoral Associate:

The Legion of Mary Handbook regularly speaks of and deeply explores Mary's role in the Church, especially in regards to her motherhood of the Church and the growth (or rather birth) of Church in the world. The Holy Family represents to us the Church as the mustard seed. In it we see simply a family, in the most unusual circumstances- united around Jesus. But when we consider the fact that the Church is the Body of Christ is in fact Jesus himself mystically present in the world, then it is also true that the Church was mystically present at the tiny of home of Nazareth in the persons of Joseph, Mary and, most importantly, Jesus. Since those days at Nazareth, the Church, God's family, has grown to the ends of the earth. Nevertheless, it is important to remember that God's plans never vary or change and both Mary and St. Joseph retain their roles in the



Church— Mary as Mother of the Church, and Joseph as the Guardian and Protector of the Church.

It is of that last point that I want to dwell, as we already know much about Mary's motherhood but little of Joseph's fatherhood. Joseph himself retains his role as foster-father of the brethren of Jesus and his heart has likewise expanded to this new dimension of his fatherhood of the Church. His fatherhood surpasses that of Abraham, who was to be the father of a myriad. Joseph is the father of the Church, the Kingdom of God, the embrace of all humanity to the Cross of Jesus Christ. He, like Mary, is a most powerful intercessor against temptation and demonic possession. His job remains to keep us safe from evil that will try to befall us.

And so I encourage you to spend time before the nativity scene in our Church or in your home, reflecting upon the great and mysterious roles that Mary and Joseph played in the history of our salvation at Bethlehem, Egypt, and Nazareth, but especially on their roles in the Church today. I encourage you to spend time in prayer, asking them for their intercession for your spiritual life and your needs. If your heart stirs you, I also

invite you to consider the Legion of Mary at our parish. Let us never cease to turn to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph in our need.

Ministries & Reflections



Feast of the Week- The Holy Name of Jesus

The St. Paul wrote in Philippians that God the Father gave Christ Jesus "that name that is above every name" (see 2:9), and at the sound of this name, "every knee should bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord." This name is the terror of demons and the hope of sinners. We celebrate this feast on January 3rd in particular because it is the traditional day corresponding to the age that Jesus received his name from Mary and Joseph, who had been given it by angels. This devotion became popular because of 12th-century Cistercian monks and nuns but especially through the preaching of Saint Bernardine of Siena, a 15thcentury Franciscan. St. Bernardine used devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus as a way of overcoming bitter and often bloody class struggles and family rivalries or vendettas in Italian city-states. The devotion grew, partly because of Franciscan and Dominican preachers. It spread even more widely after the Jesuits began promoting it in the 16th century. In 1530, Pope Clement V approved an Office of the Holy Name for the Franciscans. In 1721, Pope Innocent XIII extended this feast to the entire Church.

Prayer of the Week

A Prayer to the Holy Family

JESUS, Son of God and Son of Mary, bless our family. Graciously inspire in us the unity, peace, and mutual love that you found in your own family in the little town of Nazareth. MARY, Mother of Jesus and Our Mother, nourish our family with your faith and your love. Keep us close to your Son, Jesus, in all our sorrows and joys. JOSEPH, Fosterfather to Jesus, guardian and spouse of Mary, keep our family safe from harm. Help us in all times of discouragement or anxiety. HOLY FAMILY OF NAZARETH, make our family one with you. Amen.

For Your Reflection:

Prophesying about the God-Man, the Prophet foretold: Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved. The holy Apostle Paul repeats the Prophet's words. If you confess the Word in your mouth, he says, the Lord Jesus, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. The holy Apostle Peter, after healing a man who had been lame from his birth by the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, bore witness before the Jewish Sanhedrin in the following words: Rulers of the people and elders of Israel! If we (the holy Apostles Peter and John) are being crossexamined today for a kindness done to a helpless man, and are questioned how he has been saved and healed, be it known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, Whom you crucified, Whom God raised from the dead, in Him this man is standing here before you well and strong. For there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we can be saved. The use of the all-holy, divine name Jesus in prayer, and prayer in His name, was 'appointed by our Lord Jesus Christ Himself. We can be convinced of this from the most sublime and profound conversation recorded in the Gospel of St. John which the Lord had with the holy Apostles after the Mystical Supper, in that momentous hour which preceded the Lord's voluntary departure to the place of His betrayal and agony, for the salvation of mankind. The teaching given by the Lord in that hour has the character of a final, death-bed instruction in which He gathered and expounded before His disciples, and in their persons before the whole of Christendom, the most soul-saving and final commandments, sure and infallible pledges of eternal life.

Among other pledges and spiritual gifts, there is given and ratified the command and permission to pray by the name of Jesus. Whatever you ask the Father may be glorified in the His disciples, I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. It you ask anything in My name, I will do it. Truly, truly I tell you, you ask whatever the Father in My name, He will give you. So far you have asked for nothing in My name. Ask and you will receive, that your joy may overflow. What is it that will be given to a person who prays in the name of the Lord Jesus that can fill him to overflowing with joy? He will be given—we reply in the words of our Lord—

joy? He will be given—we reply in the words of our Lord—the Holy Spirit Whom the Father will send in My name.


