

From our Pastoral Associate:

Palm Sunday kicks off Holy Week, giving us the opportunity to relive the events surrounding the 3 greatest days of history— what the Church calls the Sacred Triduum— Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. These events, while happening in the early first century, bear an eternal dimension that touches us today. I believe it worthwhile to explore this.

When God became man in Jesus Christ, he took time into his eternity. Time, especially the time in which Jesus acts, takes on an eternal dimension. This is why we say that there is always and everywhere one Mass. There are not Masses in the strict sense—but one Mass in which every Mass

throughout all time brings us into contact— this is nothing less than the Last Supper, Suffering, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord. Jesus died only once, but we are constantly brought back to that moment to give our adoration and our worship. The Sacred Triduum is the Church's way of bringing this into sharper focus by separating these events into their own separate liturgies. So beginning with today, Palm Sunday, we wave palm branches as the Cross—representing Jesus, enters the Church—representing the heavenly Jerusalem. On Holy Thursday, we relive the events of the Last Supper including the washing of Jesus' disciples' feet, the Last Supper (in the Eucharistic liturgy), and the procession of Jesus and his disciples to the Garden, a special place in the church made to look like a garden. We then spend time with Jesus in the Eucharist, remembering his words, "Could you not watch with me one hour?"

On Good Friday we relive the Passion of Jesus in the readings, placing ourselves in the crowd by our sins as we call for Jesus' death. We pray for all the world, as Jesus did from the Cross. And we depart in silence, our hearts and

minds full of sorrow for the calamitous death of Jesus. We then spend one day in silence. No sacraments are to be performed except for confession, anointing of the sick, and baptism in (continued on page 3)

Saint of the Week-St. Longinus

St. Longinus is the Roman centurion who pierced the side of Our Lord while He was hanging on the Cross. St. Longinus, who was nearly blind, was healed when some of the blood and water from Jesus fell into his eyes. It was then he exclaimed "Indeed, this was the Son of God!" [Mark 15:39]. St. Longinus then converted, left the army, took instruction from the apostles and became a monk in Cappadocia. There he was arrested for his faith, his teeth forced out and tongue cut off. However, St. Longinus miraculously continued to speak clearly and managed to destroy several idols in the presence of the governor. The governor, who was made blind by the demons that came from the idols, had his sight restored when St. Longinus was being beheaded, because his blood came in contact with the governors' eyes. St. Longinus' relics are now in the church of St Augustine, in Rome. His Lance is contained in one of the four pillars over the altar in the Basilica of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

cases of emergency. The silence is jarring and moves us to our core. At the Easter Vigil, we carry candles as we wait outside Jesus' tomb, remembering the promises that God made to his people. As we finish these readings, we are met with light—the Gloria begins, bells are rung, lights are turned on, candles are lit and we rejoice exceedingly because Jesus has burst the bonds of death and has risen victorious from the grave. And finally, on Easter Sunday, we race breathlessly with the disciples to see the empty tomb for ourselves. It is a magnificent drama that unfolds over the course of 4 days. In my own personal life, these events have radically transformed who I am. If you have not yet experienced the fullness of the Triduum, I strongly recommend you do so this year.
