From our Pastor:

Dear friends and Parishioners of Our Lady of Sorrows,

Today, Palm Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week. And this week is filled with many sounds and voices. We hear the crowds singing praises to Jesus as he enters Jerusalem as the Messiah, and how those praises all too quickly turned into jeering and mocking and calling for crucifixion. Throughout the week, we'll hear crying, whipping, hammering. The cries of crucifixion, the prayers to the Father, and the deafening silence of the tomb.

The sounds of Holy Week are piercing and thunderous. Jesus cries out in a loud voice as he gives up His spirit. The curtain of the

sanctuary is ripped in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, boulders split, tombs opened. There is a betrayal with a kiss, a rooster crowing at the occasion of Peter's denial, the sound of a mother weeping.

Since this week is filled with <u>so much sound, we are called to do a lot of listening</u>. Listening to the narratives of Jesus' final days and hours and moments this week, we incline our ears to hear God's Word of love for each of us.

If you've never attended the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday or the Easter Vigil you might consider attending this year. The liturgies are grace filled. All of these are opportunities for us to listen. In such a noisy world, with so many distractions we need these moments to listen to the Word of God.

It was the practice of many homes to turn off all the radios and televisions on Good Friday, as a way of saying this is not a day for entertainment, but a day of turning my heart to what matters most. If all we listen to are the sounds of the world: the bitterness, the resentment, the violence, and the lust, our lives will soon only echo the values of the world.

This week, I encourage you to make time to read through the passion narratives again or rewatch Mel Gibson's The Passion of Christ movie. Perhaps pick the part of the

passion or a character that resonates with you most. A day shouldn't go by during this Holiest Week of the Church year, without spending quality time in prayerful reflection upon Jesus' Passion.

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week– Mary, Mother of Sorrows During Holy Week, we should find ourselves drawing ever nearer to our Blessed Mother, who endured the greatest sorrows on behalf of her Son. It is important to remember that as Jesus hung upon the Cross, he saw his mother and the Apostle John. He said to her, "Woman, behold your son." To John he said, "Behold your mother." John, in his Gospel, indicates that we should stand in his place, choosing to write of himself as "the beloved disciple." So when Jesus named Mary as the Mother of the Church and of all Christians, he did so as she was wracked by her sorrows. Our Lady of Sorrows has much to teach us of the great and abiding love of Jesus. She knows the pain we endure, nothing is beyond her understanding because of what she endured at the foot of the Cross. According to Tradition, in later years after the Resurrection, Mary used to retrace the path that Jesus followed from the court of Pilate to Golgotha and then to the Empty Tomb, remembering what transpired at each point along the way. This became known as the Stations of the Cross. This week, take some time to pray through the Stabat Mater Dolorosa and the Stations of the Cross. Walk the Way of Sorrows with Mary as we recount the incredible sorrows of Good Friday and the overwhelming joy of Easter Sunday.
