


From our Pastor:

Dear friends and parishioners of Our Lady of Sorrows,

This has been a tough week for me and many of you hearing the circumstances surrounding the horrific shooting of a young Ralph Yarl here in Kansas City but also for Kaylin Gillis in New York. Like so many of us, the young lad became lost in an unfamiliar neighborhood and knocked on the wrong doorbell. This normal incident quickly escalated into a terrorizing, traumatizing and life-threatening encounter for the young Ralph. The perpetrator of the crime did not ask Ralph any questions, didn't engage him in a dialogue, call the police on him nor he did not take any time to assess the situation. Upon seeing that Ralph is a young African American boy, Lester shot him. And then, while Ralph lay on the ground helpless, traumatized, and afraid, he shot him again. He then moved back into his house, back to his bed and continued with life like nothing had just happened. This is despicable, deplorable, and inhumane! When did the love of helping a stranded stranger become charged with a gun and a bullet? When did the concern and care for the minors in our midst become a threat and not an opportunity to guide them? We ask. We don't normally answer our doorbells armed, but with curiosity of a human being on the other side of world.

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Louis de Montfort

St. Louis de Montfort was a priest ordained in 1700 and regularly preached missions in France. Louis de Montfort is most famous for his writings on the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Rosary, particularly his True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, which taught that Jesus and Mary are inseparable in their love for souls and that the best and most true devotion to Jesus was a total consecration to Jesus through Mary. He argued that "Mary is the safest, easiest, shortest, and most perfect way of approaching Jesus." This consecration entailed giving one's entire being and possessions, both spiritual and eternal, to Mary for her to do with them as she would in union with the perfect will of Jesus. This consecration has influenced many aspects of the Church, including many papal encyclicals and teachings, the spirituality of Pope St. John Paul II, and the creation of the Legion of Mary, which is the largest Catholic lay apostolate in the world. St. Louis helped to found three religious orders known as the Company of Mary, the Daughters of Wisdom, and the Brothers of St. Gabriel. He often spent many months at a time living in solitude as a hermit when not preaching missions. He preached his final mission at Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre, where he fell ill and died. St. Louis de Montfort was canonized in 1947 by Pope Pius XII.

The Holy Hour for Marriage

Our next Holy Hour for Marriage will be at 6pm on May 18th at Our Lady of Sorrows and is monthly on the third Thursday of every month. The Holy Hour is for married and engaged couples to come and pray in eucharistic adoration over each other and for the needs of their marriage. There will be a short reflection on an aspect of married life and confession. When it is over, all couples are encouraged to go on a date with their spouse or fiancé. We encourage our parishioners to come and pray during this time.

The only reason the perpetrator of the crime gave for his heinous action was that he was fearful of his life. Fearful of a harmless black kid? Having lived in America for the last 15 years, I have observed how fear is often misplaced and sometimes rationalized to commit crimes. It's no longer an emotional response to a threat but its continually being charged with hatred, segregation, and intolerance. Fear is being weaponized to cause harm and destruction of life. While fear was an underlying factor in this case, we as Catholics have an obligation to call out the evils of our society. We are called to be the voice of the voiceless and support such families as they navigate the traumatic and hurtful feelings of a loved one. Our hearts ache knowing that this act was unjustifiable but realize that for people of color the ache is even deeper. And it comes from knowing that our lives could one day be in the very same danger. It's hard to articulate what these types of events do to a soul as the frustration and pain compound over a lifetime. For those who aren't black, simply validating that there's a disparity in how people are treated can go a long way to provide comfort. Sometimes those who are hurting don't need you to present a cure for what ails them, but simply to show compassion in the midst of their grief. Prayers for young Ralph and Godspeed on his recovery.

The Totus Tuus

Totus tuus ego sum, et omnia mea tua sunt. Accipio te in mea omnia. Praebe mihi cor tuum, Maria.

I belong entirely to you, and all that I have is yours. I take you for my all. O Mary, give me your heart.

This prayer, composed by St. Louis de Montfort, is a short form of the total consecration that can be prayed daily by those who have made the consecration. St. John Paul II included the words "Totus Tuus" as his motto on his papal coat of arms.
