#### From our Pastor:

Dear Friends and Parishioners of Our Lady of Sorrows, Next Saturday, May 4th, we will be part of a historic Catholic event in Kansas City. Behold KC, taking place at the National WWI Museum, is not



just a local gathering but a significant event in the U.S. bishops' three-year National Eucharistic Revival. This initiative by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) aims to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Behold KC represents a pivotal moment in this nationwide effort, anticipated to be one of the largest Eucharistic celebrations in modern Kansas City history. Behold KC is a free public event designed to recreate the spirit of the first major outdoor Eucharistic Adoration held at this same location in 1941 (see the above photo of the 1941 Eucharistic congress). It embodies a historical continuum of faith and worship, aligning with the USCCB's vision of fostering a Eucharistic culture through such significant public expressions of faith.

This profound gathering will draw thousands from the Catholic community across Kansas and Missouri. The schedule from 4 PM to 9:30 PM includes performances by local Catholic choirs (St. Monica presenting two selections), the Rosary, Holy Mass, and concludes with Eucharistic Adoration accompanied by music led by a nationally recognized Catholic recording artist Steve Angrisano.

This event offers a unique opportunity for both Catholics and non-Catholics to engage in a deep and collective expression of faith and devotion in a historic setting. As we gather together, we remember our role in the National Eucharistic Revival, which focuses on three key goals: increasing understanding of the Eucharist in the Church, fostering Eucharistic worship outside of the Mass, and encouraging Eucharistic living among Catholics. Behold KC is thus more than an event—it is a call to faith, a beacon of the New Evangelization, and a renewal of our communal commitment to Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. I encourage you to join with family and friends in this unique Eucharistic celebration. It is not just a day of prayer, but a moment to live out our faith vividly in the heart of Kansas City.

I look forward to joining you in this communal prayer and celebration. Let us come together to behold the mystery of faith in our midst, as we continue our journey of faith, hope, and love within the living Church.

## **Ministries & Reflections**



#### Saint of the Week- St. Catherine of Siena

St. Catherine of Siena was the 23rd child of Jacopo and Lapa Benincasa and grew up as an intelligent, cheerful, and intensely religious person. She entered the Dominican Third Order at 18 and spent the next three years in seclusion, prayer, and austerity. Gradually, a group of followers gathered around her-men and women, priests and religious. An active public apostolate grew out of her contemplative life. She began to take a larger role in public matters. Despite receiving detractors who did not like her candor, the Dominican order cleared her of all charges. Her public influence reached great heights because of her evident holiness, her membership in the Dominican Third Order, and the deep impression she made on the pope. She worked tirelessly for the crusade against the Turks and for peace between Florence and the pope. In 1378, the Great Schism began, splitting the allegiance of Christendom between two, then three, popes and putting even saints on opposing sides. Catherine spent the last two years of her life in Rome, in prayer and pleading on behalf of the cause of Pope Urban VI and the unity of the Church. She offered herself as a victim for the Church in its agony. She died surrounded by her "children" and was canonized in 1461. Her writings have since become spiritual classics. She has been declared a Doctor of the Church.

#### **Rediscover Your Faith**

#### For Your Reflection:

We believe that the Word became flesh and that we receive his flesh in the Lord's Supper. How then can we fail to believe that he really dwells within us? When he became man, he actually clothed himself in our flesh, uniting it to himself for ever. In the sacrament of his body he actually gives us his own flesh, which he has united to his divinity. This is why we are all one, because the Father is in Christ, and Christ is in us. He is in us through his flesh and we are in him. With him we form a unity which is in God.

The manner of our indwelling in him through the sacrament of his body and blood is evident from the Lord's own words: This world will see me no longer but you shall see me. Because I live you shall live also, for I am in my Father, you are in me, and I am in you. If it had been a question of mere unity of will, why should he have given us this explanation of the steps by which it is achieved? He is in the Father by reason of his divine nature, we are in him by reason of his human birth, and he is in us through the mystery of the sacraments. This, surely, is what he wished us to believe; this is how he wanted us to understand the perfect unity that is achieved through our Mediator, who lives in the Father while we live in him, and who, while living in the Father, lives also in us. This is how we attain to unity with the Father. Christ is in very truth in the Father by his eternal generation; we are in very truth in Christ, and he likewise is in us.

Christ himself bore witness to the reality of his unity when he said: He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him. No one will be in Christ unless Christ himself has been in him; Christ will take to himself only the flesh of those who have received his flesh.

He had already explained the mystery of this perfect unity when he said: As the living Father sent me and I draw life from the Father, so he who eats my flesh will draw life from me. We draw life from his flesh just as he draws life from the Father. Such comparisons aid our understanding, since we can grasp a point more easily when we have an analogy. And the point is that Christ is the wellspring of our life. Since we who are in the flesh have Christ dwelling in us through his flesh, we shall draw life from him in the same way he draws life from the Father.


