From our Pastoral Associate:

In our readings today, I am struck by the Catholicity of the Church, particularly after the events of this week. In our first reading, Paul and Barnabas extend their preaching to the Gentiles who are delighted to have them come among them. The Gospel was meant not just for the Jew, but for all other people as well. In our second reading, John has a vision of the heavenly host gathered around the throne of the Lamb. And finally we read



about Jesus declaring that "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me... no one can take them out of my hand."

These many descriptions of rejoicing crowds who constitute the flock of Jesus naturally make me think of the rejoicing crowds in St. Peter's square who anxiously waited to see our new pope. As I'm sure you're aware, Robert Francis Prevost, a Chicago native, was elected as the first pope from the United States, taking the name Leo XIV. He is a member of the Augustinian order of friars and has spent his life between America and as a missionary to Peru. Seeing the joyful celebration of a new Pope by the crowds and knowing that jubilant celebration was magnified across the world, these readings take on a whole new sense of meaning. We are one Church, united as the flock of Jesus Christ. The extension of the ministry by Paul and Barnabas (as well as the rest of the Apostles) to Gentiles is clearly shown by the vast array of people enumerated in the crowds. It is impossible not to notice in all the footage the vast number of flags of countless nations being waved by representatives of those lands. The Gospel has reached all corners of the earth and the triumph of Jesus Christ that (continued on page 3)



Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Matthias.

According to Acts 1:15-26, during the days after the Ascension Peter stood up in the midst of the brothersabout 120 of Jesus' followers. Now that Judas had betrayed his ministry, it was necessary, Peter said, to fulfill the scriptural recommendation that another should take his office. "Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection" (Acts 1:21-22). They nominated two men: Joseph Barsabbas and Matthias. They prayed and drew lots. The choice fell upon Matthias, who was added to the Eleven.Matthias is not mentioned by name anywhere else in the New Testament. We do know, however, that he was a follower of Jesus from the beginning and was among those that received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, going out into the streets and preaching boldly. Non-biblical accounts of his life tend to contradict. Some say Matthias brought the Gospel west to Germanic regions. Others say he traveled south to Ethiopia to convert the cannibals. Still others say his evangelical journeys north brought him to Cappadocia. But wherever he went, Matthias is said to have performed many miracles that left people seized with wonder and joy that such a faith was possible. It is believed that St. Matthias died in Jerusalem, having been ordered to be put to death by the Jewish High Priest, first being stoned and then beheaded.
