From our Pastor: The True Christian Uniform: Love

In the early beginnings of the Church, Christians faced tremendous challenges in expressing who they were. For over three hundred years, the **Roman Empire** forbade them from practicing their faith publicly. In a world that misunderstood and persecuted them, Christians had to find creative ways to communicate their identity and distinguish themselves from the pagans and



non-believers around them. One of the ways they did this was through uniforms—visible signs that set them apart and subtly expressed their allegiance to Christ. These outward signs became a silent witness in a world that often refused to listen.

Over time, this tradition continued in various forms. Today, we see it in the regalia of groups like the Knights and Ladies Auxiliary of Peter Claver, the Knights of Columbus, the Knights of Malta, the Swiss Guards etc. We see it in the habits of monks and nuns and in the white collars worn by the Pope, Bishops, priests and deacons. These uniforms do more than identify a person—they reveal the office, mission, and community to which the wearer belongs. But while these uniforms are meaningful, Jesus invites us to wear a garment that goes deeper than fabric. In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the true Christian uniform when He says: "This I command you: love one another as I love you." This love is not sentimental or surface-level. It is sacrificial, merciful, and deeply rooted in the heart of God. It is the kind of love that forgives enemies, serves the poor, comforts the broken, and speaks truth even when it's costly. Love is the Christian's most powerful identifier. It is our nabit. It is our robe. It is (continued on page 3)

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Bernardine of Siena

Bernardine was born in Tuscany in 1380, the son of a governor. When he was 20, the plague was at its height in his hometown of Siena. Sometimes as many as 20 people died in one day at the hospital. Bernardine offered to run the hospital and, with the help of other young men, nursed patients there for four months. At 22, he entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained two years later. For almost a dozen years he lived in solitude and prayer, but his gifts ultimately caused him to be sent to preach. He always traveled on foot, sometimes speaking for hours in one place, then doing the same in another town. Especially known for his devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus, Bernardine devised a symbol—IHS, the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek—in Gothic letters on a blazing sun. This was to displace the superstitious symbols of the day, as well as the insignia of factions: The devotion spread, and the symbol began to appear in churches, homes and public buildings. Opposition arose from those who thought it a dangerous innovation. Three attempts were made to have the pope take action against him, but Bernardine's holiness, orthodoxy, and intelligence were evidence of his faithfulness. General of the Friars of the Strict Observance, a branch of the Franciscan Order, Bernardine strongly emphasized scholarship and further study of theology and canon law. When he started there were 300 friars in the community; when he died there were 4,000. He returned to preaching the last two years of his life, dying while traveling in 1444.

May they see and encounter Christ.
