From our Pastor: The Feast of the Ascension

Can you imagine standing on a hill, watching someone you love disappear into the clouds? That's what the disciples experienced on the day of the Ascension. Forty days after the Resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven right before their eyes. One moment he was blessing them... the next, he was gone. Or so it seemed. But this wasn't a goodbye. This was a handover. This was Jesus saying, "Now, it's your turn."

The Acts of the Apostles tells us the disciples were left staring into the sky—until two angels appeared and asked, "Why do you stand here looking up?" (Acts 1:11). In other words: don't just stand there! Go! Live! Witness! The Ascension invites us to stop living with our heads in the clouds and start living with our feet on the ground—and our eyes fixed on the mission Jesus gave us.

The Ascension reveals three important truths:

Christ is glorified – Jesus, fully God and fully human, now sits at the right hand of the Father. His humanity is taken up into heaven, giving us a glimpse of our own destiny in Christ. The Ascension reminds us that heaven is our true home.

The Church is empowered – Jesus' final words to his disciples were a command: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). The mission of Christ is now the mission of the Church.

The Spirit is coming – Before ascending, Jesus promises, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you" (Acts 1:8). The Ascension prepares us for Pentecost—the birth of the Church.

At the Ascension, Jesus didn't give a detailed strategic plan. He simply said: "You will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). That's our job (continued on page 3)

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Boniface

Boniface, known as the apostle of the Germans, was an English Benedictine monk who gave up being elected abbot to devote his life to the conversion of the Germanic tribes. Two characteristics stand out: his Christian orthodoxy and his fidelity to the pope of Rome. How absolutely necessary this orthodoxy and fidelity were is borne out by the conditions Boniface found on his first missionary journey in 719 at the request of Pope Gregory II. Paganism was a way of life. What Christianity he did find had either lapsed into paganism or was mixed with error. The clergy were mainly responsible for these latter conditions since they were in many instances uneducated, lax and questionably obedient to their bishops. In particular instances their very ordinations were questionable. These are the conditions that Boniface was to report in 722 on his first return visit to Rome. The Holy Father instructed him to reform the German Church. The pope sent letters of recommendation to religious and civil leaders. Boniface later admitted that his work would have been unsuccessful, from a human viewpoint, without a letter of safe-conduct from Charles Martel, the powerful Frankish ruler, grandfather of Charlemagne. Boniface was finally made a regional bishop and authorized to organize the whole German Church. He was eminently successful. In the Frankish kingdom, he met great problems because of lay interference in bishops' elections, the worldliness of the clergy and lack of papal control. During a final mission to the Frisians, Boniface and 53 companions were massacred while he was preparing converts for confirmation.

description: to be living signs of Jesus' presence in the world. In our homes, at our workplaces, on our streets, in the parish—our faith isn't private. It's public. It's purposeful.

Being a witness doesn't mean preaching on street corners (though it could!). It means living with love, courage, joy, and mercy. It means forgiving those who hurt us. It means helping those who are forgotten. It means letting our lives speak louder than our words. The Ascension isn't just about Jesus going up—it's about us rising up. Rising to our calling. Rising to hope. Rising to meet the Spirit, who will come at Pentecost and light our hearts on fire. Jesus now reigns in glory, but he didn't leave us behind. He left us with a mission—and a promise: "I am with you always."

This week, ask yourself:

Where is God inviting me to grow?
Is there someone I need to reach out to in love?
What's one small way I can be a witness to Christ this week?
