From our Pastor:

God is a Community of Love—So Are We

This Sunday, we celebrate one of the most beautiful and mysterious truths of our faith: **Trinity Sunday**. It's the only Sunday in the Church year dedicated to a doctrine—not a specific event. But it's not just theology for theologians. The Trinity is the beating heart of our Christian life.

So, what does it mean when we say God is Trinity? We're saying that God is one—but not solitary. God is three persons in one divine essence: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each Person is fully God, yet not three Gods, but one God. If that makes your head spin a little, you're not alone! But at its core, this isn't a math problem. It's a love story. At the heart of the Trinity is relationship. The Father eternally loves the Son. The Son receives that love and returns it completely. And the love between them is so real, so personal, that it is the Holy Spiritthe bond of love itself.



So, God is not a distant power or an isolated being. God is a community of love. A communion. A family. And here's the amazing part: you and I were created in God's image—not just individually, but communally. That means we are created from love, for love, to be love. Let's make this real:

- Think about your family. Do you reflect God's love in how you speak to each other?
- Look at our parish. Do we welcome newcomers with the warmth of the Trinity?
- Consider your friendships. Are they marked by self-giving love, or self-interest? (continued on page 3)

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. John of Matha

John de Matha was born on June 24, 1154 (or 1160) in a small village in the French Alps. He received a classical education at the college of Aix-en-Provence, Marseille and finally Paris, the intellectual center of all Christendom. There he earned the degree of Doctor of Theology and taught at the Cathedral School. Deeply religious and pious, he wanted to devote himself entirely to God and His service, asking Him for a sign to show him the way forward. Ordained a priest by Maurice de Sully, bishop of Paris and builder of Notre Dame, he celebrated his first Mass on January 28, 1193. During the celebration of the Eucharist, at the time of the consecration, he pleaded with the Lord to graciously show him which religious order he should enter for his salvation. He received a vision of a new order, which he was to found. John joined a group of hermits in the forest of Cerfroid, 70 kilometers northeast of Paris. These men would become the Order of the Holy Trinity and Slaves. This order would focus on ransoming Christian captives, particularly those held by the muslims during the Crusades. He made many trips to Africa, redeeming at least 100 slaves each trip. On one occasion the ship returning with the captives was attacked by Muslims who were angry because John gave their prisoners hope and perseverance in their faith. They raided his ship, tore away the helm, and tore the sails, leaving them to die at sea. The captives, however rigged their cloaks as sails and made it to Italy safely. St. John died in 1213 and the Trinitarians continue to this day, heroically serving those in persecuted regions whose faith is in peril.

And here's the big one: Are we building communities that reflect God's unity in diversity?

The Trinity invites us to live differently. Not as self-sufficient islands, but as people rooted in relationship. Where unity doesn't mean uniformity. Where love doesn't end with sentiment but becomes action. Here's a challenge for this week:

Take one step to live "trinitarianly." Reach out to someone who feels isolated. Forgive someone who hurt you. Start a conversation with someone you usually avoid. Join or invite someone into a small group, a ministry, or a meal. When you do this, you're not just being nice—you're participating in God's very life. Trinity Sunday is not about solving a mystery. It's about stepping into it. The Trinity is not a puzzle to figure out—it's a love to be lived.

So come, community of St. Monica/Our Lady of Sorrow Parish. Let's be what we were made to be: a reflection of the God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—One God, a communion of love.
