From our Pastoral Associate:

Today celebrates the Holy Feast of Pentecost, which represents the birthday of the Church. Pentecost comes in fulfillment of the promise of Jesus at the Last Supper that that he would send the Holy Spirit to be with us always. The Holy Spirit should not be taken lightly. He is God himself, the third member of the Holy Trinity. He is all loving, all knowing, and all powerful— and he chooses to come down and live within our souls, helping us to live out the teachings of



Jesus and to come to eternal life. It's important to foster a love and devotion to God the Holy Spirit in our Christian lives. He forms an essential part of who we are as Christians.

Somone that can help us to grow in love with the Holy Spirit is the Blessed Virgin Mary, who is named by the Church as "the Spouse of the Holy Spirit." Mary's heart has always been a perfect sanctuary for the Holy Spirit from her earliest moments. When she gave her yes to the archangel Gabriel at the Annunciation, she was immediately overshadowed by the Holy Spirit, calling to mind the presence of God, coming in the form of a cloud, that filled Solomon's Temple at its dedication. Mary constantly sought out to know the wisdom of God by pondering on the meaning of things she learned as she observed and listened to Jesus and what was said about him. And she was present in the upper room, praying for the coming of the Holy Spirit. It was by her prayer, and that of the disciples, that brought the Holy Spirit down at Pentecost.

The Legion of Mary, of which I am a member, has a particular devotion to the Holy Spirit and the handbook states that "Mary is commonly called the temple or the sanctuary, but these terms are insufficiently expressive of the reality, which is that he has so united her to himself as to make her the next thing in dignity to himself. Mary has been so taken up into the Holy Spirit, made one with him, animated by him, that he is as her very soul. She is no mere instrument (continued on page 3)

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Barnabas

Barnabas, a Jew of Cyprus, comes as close as anyone outside the Twelve to being a full-fledged apostle. He was closely associated with Saint Paul—he introduced Paul to Peter and the other apostles—and served as a kind of mediator between the former persecutor and the still suspicious Jewish Christians. When a Christian community developed at Antioch, Barnabas was sent as the official representative of the church of Jerusalem to incorporate them into the fold. He and Paul instructed in Antioch for a year, after which they took relief contributions to Jerusalem. Later Paul and Barnabas, now clearly seen as charismatic leaders, were sent by Antioch officials to preach to the gentiles. Enormous success crowned their efforts. After a miracle at Lystra, the people wanted to offer sacrifice to them as gods— Barnabas being Zeus, and Paul, Hermes—but the two said, "We are of the same nature as you, human beings. We proclaim to you good news that you should turn from these idols to the living God" (see Acts 14:8-18). But all was not peaceful. They were expelled from one town, they had to go to Jerusalem to clear up the ever-recurring controversy about circumcision, and even the best of friends can have differences. When Paul wanted to revisit the places they had evangelized, Barnabas wanted to take along his cousin John Mark, author of the Gospel, but Paul insisted that since Mark had deserted them once, he was not fit to take along now. The disagreement that followed was so sharp that Barnabas and Paul separated: Barnabas taking Mark to Cyprus, Paul taking Silas to Syria. Later they were reconciled—Paul, Barnabas and Mark.

or channel of his activity; she is an intelligent, conscious co-operator with him to such degree that when she acts, it is also he who acts; and that if her intervention be not accepted, neither is his." So turning to Mary will necessarily turn us closer to the Holy Spirit as well. As such, every devotion to Mary, when we're conscious of this connection, will necessarily deepen our relationship with Mary. This is especially true of the Rosary. The rosary forms a prime devotion to the Holy spirit by reason of it being the chief prayer to Our Lady, but the 20 mysteries also celebrate the principle interventions of the Holy Spirit in the drama of our redemption. It is very important to grow closer to him through these devotions. He is, after all, God, and to not appreciate him as fully as we are able is to neglect to know God as well as we ought. We will also fail to see him at work in our lives, and even worse, fail to turn to him when he is ready and able to help.

I encourage you to turn your heart and mind to him regularly and to seek him out, particularly in Marian devotions such as the Rosary. And be sure to take time to thank him for the many gifts he has given us both previously and in the here and now.
