From our Pastoral Associate:

In today's Gospel we read of Jesus and Peter walking on water. I've always been struck by the 12 century mosaic of this even that can be found in Sicily (see right). St. Peter, exhibiting great faith, steps out of the boat in the middle of a storm, fully confident that Jesus will allow him to walk on water. As he walks out to Jesus, he does not keep his eyes on the Lord, but allows the things around him- the wind, the waves- to frighten him, causing his faith to falter. What's telling is that Peter was so close to Jesus (the Gospel tells us that he is just within reach of Jesus), but allows himself to be distracted by what is unimportant.

In the mosaic, we see Peter sinking into the waves. In his panic, he looks again at Jesus, crying out "Lord, save me!" Jesus effortlessly reaches out and begins to lift him up. Meanwhile, every apostle in the boat is focused



upon Jesus, not Peter. This is not because they aren't concerned for Peter's plight. Quite the contrary. Rather, they are so concerned that they naturally turn to the only person that can save Peter—Jesus. Their hands are stretched out to Jesus in a gesture of prayer and supplication for Peter.

We should learn a triple lesson from this. The first is that we should, as much as possible, never allow ourselves to get distracted from our walk with Jesus by the waves and storms of this world that seek to rob us of our peace and joy. We should always stay focused on him. However, when we inevitably do become distracted (and our fallen human nature practically guarantees this), we should always cry out to Jesus with the words of Peter, "Lord, save me!" He will not fail to do so. The third lesson is that when we see others struggling, falling away, or sinking into the mire of this world, we should always turn first to Jesus to bring them back. We should seek him and prayer and lay the concern for their soul before the Good Shepherd, whose concern is that his sheep "have life and have it abundantly." (Jn 10:11)

As we go through this week, let's take a hard look at the things that distract us from following Jesus and, with them in mind, cry out to Jesus, "Lord, save me!"

Saint of the Week-St. Stephen of Hungary

St. Stephen was a member of the Árpád dynasty of Hungary, which is the family that has produced the most saints and blessed of any single family, including St. Stephen, St. Emeric, St. Ladislaus, St. Irene of Hungary, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, St. Kinga, Bl. Yolanda, St. Margaret of Hungary, Bl. Elizabeth the Widow, and Bl. Elizabeth of Hungary. Born a pagan, Stephen was baptized at the age of 10 with his father Geza, who was the Grand Prince of Hungary. At the age of 20 he married Gisela, the sister of the future Holy Roman Emperor St. Henry. The wedding was celebrated by St. Adalbert. When Stephen succeed his father, he pushed forward the Christianization of the country for both political and religious reasons. He suppressed a series of revolts by pagan nobles. He asked for the pope to provide for the Church's organization in Hungary and requested that the pope confer the title of King upon him. He was crowned on Christmas day in 1001, making him the first king of Hungary. He developed a system of tithes that supported churches and pastors and helped to relieve the poor. Out of every 10 towns, one had to build a church and support a priest. He abolished pagan customs and commanded all but clergy and religious to marry. He made himself easily accessible to all, especially the poor. He died in 1038 and was canonized, along with his son St. Emeric in 1083.

Reflecting on Our History:

This is a continuation of the parish's history.

The parish began to raise funds for the new church. Fr. Richard started a "Bau-Verein"—or society for raising the

building funds— a method which proved to most popular and highly successful. All parishioners obtained subscription cards on which the time was limited to one hundred weeks. Every Sunday after the Masses, secretaries received payments on the subscriptions. Upon the arrival of Fr. Richard in Kansas City, the parish had accumulated \$21,000. At the end of one hundred weeks, however, the amount on hand had increased to the amount of \$90,000. Moreover, the various societies of the

parish made noteworthy contributions, and in addition many of the parishioners made private donations over and above their subscriptions. With such hearty cooperation on the part of the congregation, it was strikingly evident that no delay would be occasioned. Therefore, Fr. Richard proceeded to draw up a number of suggestive sketches, and finally with the help of Mr. Henry Brinkman of Emporia, it was the decision to build the new church according to the present plan. Thereupon Fr. Richard called a second parish meeting in order to show the blueprints and sketch of the new church. There was much rejoicing at that meeting.

On March 25, 1922, the ground was broken for the new church and on Sunday afternoon of July 30, 1922, the cornerstone was laid with Bishop Lillis officiating. Sunday, September 16, 1923, was truly one of the most glorious days in the parish annals, for Bishop Lillis solemnly blessed the beautiful new church of Our Lady of Sorrows. On this occasion, Bishop Lillis sang a Solemn Pontifical High Mass, and also preached the sermon. The parishioners rejoiced after all the hard work to make this day possible.
