From our Pastoral Associate:

In our Gospel for this weekend Jesus does something that on the surface seems quite puzzling. A Canaanite woman, a pagan, comes to Jesus and asks him to heal her daughter, who was afflicted by a demon. Jesus refuses to answer her, even as she continues calling out. Finally, having had enough of it, the disciples ask him to send her away. In response, Our Lord says, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel." Yet the woman persists. Jesus says, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." This woman could have been easily offended and put off. She could have walked away from Jesus and given up on the whole thing, letting her anger rule her. Instead, she humbles herself and replies, "even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." Jesus, much moved by this answer, praises her faith and grants her



This woman shows tremendous trust in Our Lord's ability to heal her daughter. She knows who he is, what he can do, and she will not let anything dissuade her from what she knows, even a harsh word of Jesus. Her faith withstands all of it. We can also see things from her vantage point—"the lost sheep of Israel" are only half-heartedly accepting Jesus. Jesus remarks on at least one occasion when he meets a pagan that, "not even in Israel have I found such faith!" This woman, whose faith is not lacking, knows there is an opportunity there and takes her chance, catching the "scraps that fall from the table of their masters." How easily do we give up in our prayer? Do we even persist when it seems impossible, that everything is stacked against us and that there's no use to keep going? Do we allow anger or frustration, or even despair to silence us? How much do we trust Jesus to do what he has promised? Do we know him well enough to be certain of what he is capable? This woman was, and her tremendous faith not only obtained an answer to her prayer and saved her daughter, but also provided such an example as to be recorded in the Gospels with great honor. So let's not lose heart as we bring God our needs and prayers.

Ministries & Reflections



Saint of the Week-St. Louis

St. Louis IX was born in 1214 in the Capetian line of Kings of France. At age 12 he was crowned King following the death of his father, King Louis VIII. His mother, Blanche of Castille, instilled in him a deep love of his Christian faith. In 1234, Louis married Margaret of Provence who also loved her faith. The two loved each other deeply and they enjoyed riding together, reading, and listening to music. Louis was a great patron of the arts and inspired much innovation in Gothic and architecture. One of the most notable of these is the famous Sainte-Chapelle in Paris, which was Louis' personal chapel, which housed the relics of the Crown of Thorns and the image of Edessa as well as some thirty other items. The Sainte-Chapelle is considered one of the greatest feats of Gothic architecture. He reformed the French legal system, giving people a direct appeal to him in suits, abolishing trials by ordeal, and incorporated the presumption of innocence into trial proceedings. His reign represented a political zenith for France in the middle ages and he was widely respected throughout Christendom. He fought in the 7th crusade and was captured while in Egypt. During his captivity he prayed the Divine Office daily. St. Louis died on his way to the 8th crusade when an epidemic of dysentery swept through his camp. He was canonized in 1297.

Reflecting on Our History:

This is a continuation of the parish's history.

With the new church dedicated, the parish turned to the interior decoration. On September 28, 1924, the new

Stations were solemnly blessed and canonically erected. The ceremonies of the occasion included singing the Veni Creator, followed by a sermon, blessing of the images and crosses, singing of the Stabat Mater, the Way of the Cross, and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. The next memorable event occurred October, 4, 1926, on the occasion of the seventh centenary of the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, founder of the Franciscan Orders. In the new church, Bishop Lillis

celebrated Solemn Pontifical High Mass.

One thing still had to be done, however, to complete the interior decoration of the new edifice: the frescoing of the walls. Through voluntary contributions on the part of the parishioners the work of frescoing was made possible, and, after careful selection of colors and designs, the task was finished in the summer of 1932— in aple time for the celebration of the Silver Jubilee of the parish in its present location, held September 18, 1932. Bishop Lillis officiated at the Solemn Pontifical High Mass, and also preached the sermon. The following evening, September 19, a social was held in the parish auditorium for all parishioners as well as for all those who had formerly resided in the parish— a "homecoming" celebration that served as a fitting climax to the jubilant occasion. Fr. Richard faithfully served as pastor of Our Lady of Sorrows over a period of fourteen years— a longer time than any of his predecessors. He was succeeded in July, 1934, by Rev. Fr. Alexander Wilberding, O.F.M. Of patriarchal mien, Fr. Alexander's kind personality at once won for him the admiration and respect of all his parishioners.
